

Great to see the rain but the humidity has started to increase disease on the greens. Dollar Spot plus other diseases are causing concern. Geoff would like to contact David Ormsby for advice and be a member of his organisation. This will give Geoff the ability to contact him on turf issues.

The coring of the greens will take place in the next week or two depending on the weather.

The earth sieve that Geoff has constructed is in use but requires fine weather to operate. Number seven green will be completely rebuilt with a temporary green in front.

The new rough mower is here. Not a moment too soon. The rain has boosted grass growth.

The lady gardeners have been very active in clearing all the undergrowth around 4 green area. Also the undergrowth around and under bushes and trees on number 9 fairway. The bridge behind 4 green has been water blasted and after a scrape/sanding will be ready for painting.
