


Membership Survey and Strategic Planning






The first task was to sort out all outstanding accounts and bring the accounting system up to date each month. We now have in place a base set of suppliers for the club and an ordering system which requires club order numbers to be obtained prior to any orders being placed or paid.

The club has also just completed successfully renewal of their club licence for the bar and food service plan for the kitchen. A special thanks here to Jenny and her team of volunteers for the outstanding job they carried out last week cleaning from top to toe the kitchen area which enable a less challenging review with the TCDC food safety inspector.



Many thanks to Bev Wickham and Tina Larsen for the countless hours they have spent setting and checking traps around our course.

Now Allie Cotter, Ann Hardie and Steve Ovens have stepped into the role and, in order to ring proof our town from rats, stoats and other vermin who kill off our native birdlife, we need to place traps to plug the holes around the golf course.

We need

- For the existing eleven Good Nature traps we need to purchase digital counters
 @ \$55 each to attach to each trap. This will enable recording of trap-set offs.
- Purchase 11 new DOC 200 traps @\$90 each, making 12 in total. These traps are strong with strung mechanisms. The benefits of these traps are that you can easily record the catches made and they are much cheaper that the Good Nature traps. These traps would be checked twice a month - once for replacing eggs and once for adding lure on the eggs.

Can you sponsor a trap and our pest control programme ???? You can have a trap named such as "Donated by the McCann Family" or not, as you wish. Already we have 6 sponsors. Can you help?

Tips for Playing golf in the Rain!!!!

Allow for less run.

When the ground is wet, the ball won't run as far. Obvious, we know, but this needs to be factored in to how you play. Less runoff the tee may mean you can take more club on holes where you would normally hold back. Approach shots are more likely to stop dead on landing; chips and pitches are more likely to grab; and putts will be slower, meaning they need to be hit more firmly and will therefore take less break.

Hit more firmly in the rough.

Wet grass will grab the club much more than normal and slow the clubhead's progress. So keep everything firmer than usual through impact in wet rough to stop the grass grabbing the club with assorted undesirable consequences!
